**Sub:** Grant of Conditional Permission to **Shri Bhanwar Lal Dugar Ayurved Vishwabharti, Gandhi Vidya Mandir, Sardarshahar, Distt.- Churu, Rajasthan with 50 seats in UG (BAMS) Course** as well as issuing **Letter of Permission (LOP)** to increase the intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course **from 50 to 60 seats** from the academic session 2019-20 under Section 13A/13C of the IMCC Act, 1970 - reg.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to refer to the Ministry's order No.R.17011/186/2018-EP (IM-1) dated 07.09.2018 related to admission matter for the academic year 2018-19 intimating certain shortcomings for rectification for consideration of the case for the academic year 2019-20.

2. Further, to refer application dated 27.08.2018 of the **Secretary, Gandhi Vidyamandir, Sardar Shahar, Distt.- Churu, Rajasthan** for seeking permission of the Central Govt. to Increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 50 to 60 seats from the academic session 2019-20 under section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970 which was forwarded to CCIM vide Ministry's letter dated 26.11.2018. Accordingly, the CCIM had visited the college on 25.01.2019 and as per the Ministry's letter dated 26.11.2018 the CCIM issued Letter of Intent to you vide Letter No.26-48/2018-College. dated 12.04.2019 to increase admission capacity from 50 to 60 seats in existing UG (BAMS) course from the academic session 2019-20 under section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970.

3. The CCIM had carried out an inspection of the institution on 09-10.05.2019 to reassess the available facilities of teaching and practical training as well as to verify the compliance submitted by the college and forwarded its recommendations and report to the Ministry. On examining the same, certain deficiencies have been observed and therefore, under provisions of the first proviso to sub-section (5) of Section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970, an opportunity of hearing was granted to the college on 21.06.2019 to present the case.

4. The observations of hearing committee based on submission made by the college representatives during hearing and recommendations & visitation report of the CCIM have been carefully examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for Under-Graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant regulations made thereunder and as per approved Standard Operative Procedures (SOPs), it is found that the College is fulfilling notified and approved criterion for granting Conditional Permission for 50 seats in UG (BAMS) course as well as for issuing Letter of Permission (LOP) to increase in intake capacity in existing UG(BAMS) course from 50 to 60 seats from the academic session 2019-20.

5. It has, therefore, been decided by the Central Government to ***grant of Conditional Permission to Shri Bhanwar Lal Dugar Ayurved Vishwabharti, Gandhi Vidya Mandir, Sardarshahar, Distt.-Churu- 331403, Rajasthan for conducting 50 seats in UG (BAMS) course as well as for issuing Letter of Permission (LOP)*** to increase in intake capacity in existing UG(BAMS) course from ***50 to 60 seats*** from the academic session 2019-20 under Section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act, 1970, subject to following conditions:

- i. The college shall submit an undertaking in form of affidavit duly notarized within one month from the date of issue of this letter explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provident Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
- ii. The colleges shall submit undertaking in the form of Affidavit duly notarized to get permanent registration of the Teachers/Hospital Clinical Staff/Consultant in concerned State Boards/Council where the college/hospital is located or Central Registration of the CCIM by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2019 as per the decisions conveyed vide letters 22.03.2019 & 22.04.2019 by CCIM and decided by the High Court of Delhi in W.P. No. 2369 of 2019, which will be verified by the Council during next visitation while considering the matter for grant/denial of permission for the academic year 2020-21.

6. It is further informed that 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 60 UG seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quotas shall be conducted by the Central Government and counseling for the remaining 85% seats shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State. If any seats are not filled up in the Central Counseling, the same shall be transferred to the said Counseling Authority to admit students as per their rules/ reservation policies/norms. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the Central counseling for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

7. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under IMCC Act & Regulations made thereunder.

8. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of CCIM and the Central Government.





9. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2019 to get permission for the session 2020-21:

- (i) all the Requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
- (ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda); and
- (iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled *in toto*


10. This permission to increase admission capacity from 50 to 60 seats in existing UG course for the first admitted batch of 2019-20 session, will be valid till such time as the first batch of students admitted against the course appear for the first final examination of the said course and at that time, the college authorities may take up the matter for recognition of the qualifications under Section 14(2) of the IMCC Act, 1970.

11. The college administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teachers, as prescribed in the relevant CCIM Regulations, are in position before the admission of the students in the above-mentioned increase in admission capacity from 50 to 60 seats in existing UG (BAMS) course is made, under intimation to the Central Government and CCIM.

12. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to CCIM under intimation to this Ministry. The CCIM will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled by means of an inspection and submit a report along with its assessment in this matter to the Ministry of AYUSH for considering the permission matter from the academic session 2020-21.


